

A SPECIAL, ONE-DAY tournament on May 4th (rain date May 11)

The May Mish-Mash Mixer To restate:

**Two Objectives:** 

1. To get captains to experience fishing with other members of the club who may or may not have a boat.

2. Catch the longest fish, any specie (excluding sharks)

Entry Fee: \$10 per person

Captains: Agree to take fellow FOC members on your boat.

**Passengers:** Agree to fish with your assigned captain on their boat.

#### **Process:**

- Captains: Pay the fee and sign up for the tournament and indicate on the sign-up sheet how many passengers you will take with you.

- Passengers: Pay the fee and sign up for the tournament.

- Mike Spanhel and John/Lori Grieder will draw passengers names and assign them to a captain. First come first served, if we have more passengers than spaces on boats then the ones signing up last will be dropped from the tournament.

"Weigh in": 4PM sharp at Mike Spanhel's house, 5657 Westshore Dr, NPR (Gulf Harbors). Late entries will NOT be considered. Do not bring fish, only a picture of your entry and its length is required. Hot dogs and chips will be provided for those who enter the tournament. BYOB. Participants may arrive at the weigh-in between 3 and 4 PM.

Payout: 1st, 2nd, 3rd -- \$25/15/10.

The entry fee will be used to cover food costs.

Any extra \$ will be added to the payout.

On March 13th I took my 12 year old grandson Zack who was visiting, as my fishing mate for the day.


